About Health System Sustainability

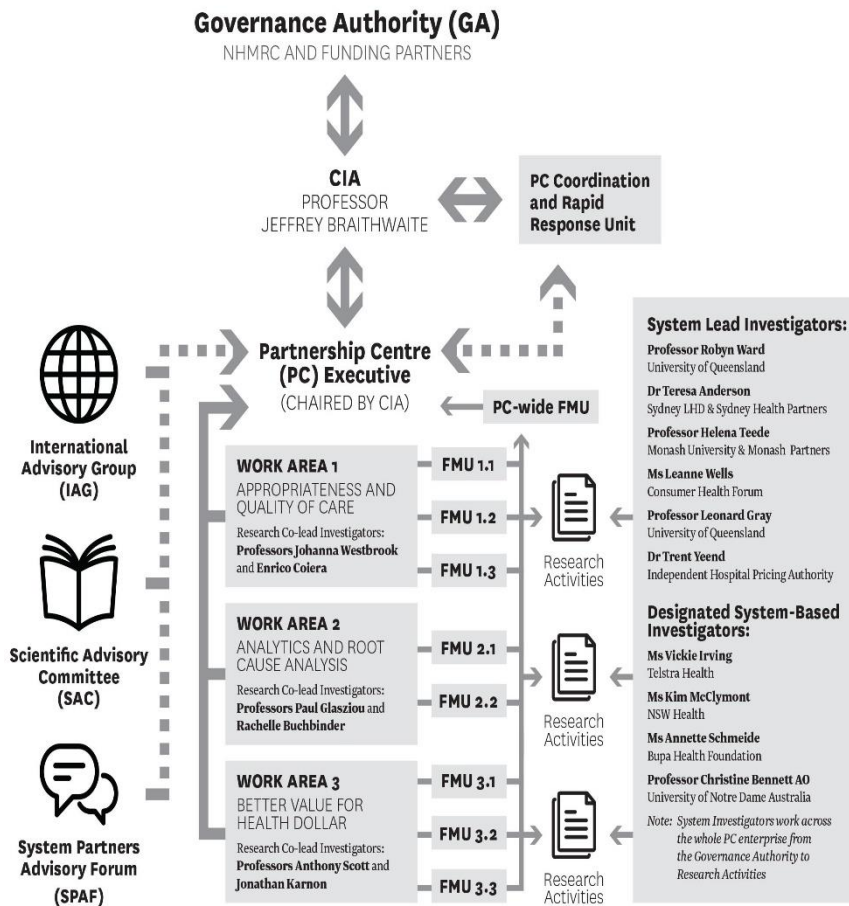
Long-term sustainability is a key challenge for the Australian health system, as it is elsewhere. A sustainable health system is one that endures and adapts to constantly changing pressures (Coiera et al 2007; Braithwaite 2016). Such resilience must come despite access to limited physical, financial and human resources, while delivering improved population and individual health and wellbeing. It must also deliver a triple bottom line of financial, social and environmental value for money and return on investment.

To achieve such sustainability, the health system must minimise low-value health care, poor workforce utilisation and financial waste, and maximise the effectiveness of every dollar spent and every hour worked. Old or ineffective models and practices must be set aside in favour of innovations in care delivery, prevention, financing incentives and new technology. This new Partnership Centre aims to conduct research that will significantly influence the evolution of a resilient health care system that is affordable, cost-effective and delivers improved health outcomes for all Australians.
